CPD Key Programs

- ❧ **HOME Investments Partnerships Program (HOME)** provides grants to States and local governments to fund a wide range of activities including 1) building, buying, and/or rehabilitating housing for rent or homeownership or 2) providing direct rental assistance to low-income families. It is the largest Federal block grant program for State and local governments designed exclusively to create affordable housing for low-income households.
- ❧ **CDBG Entitlement Program** provides annual grants on a formula basis to entitled cities and counties to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment, and by expanding economic opportunities, principally for low- and moderate-income persons.
- ❧ **CDBG State Program** allows States to award grants to smaller units of general local government that develop and preserve decent affordable housing, to provide services to the most vulnerable in our communities, and to create and retain jobs.
- ❧ **HOPWA** program is the only Federal program dedicated to addressing the housing needs of persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families. Grantees partner with nonprofit organizations and housing agencies to provide housing and support to these beneficiaries.
- ❧ **Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG)** funds are distributed by formula to metropolitan cities, urban counties, territories, and states for street outreach, emergency shelter, homelessness prevention, rapid re-housing assistance, and homeless management information systems.
- ❧ **Continuum of Care Program (CoC)** funds local networks of organizations to quickly rehouse homeless individuals and to minimize the trauma and dislocation caused to individuals, families, and communities by homelessness.




North Carolina 2015 Homeless Snapshot
